selected 2008 open studio artist bios

art sueltz As a child Art loved to paint. At age nine, over one hundred of his early paintings were displayed in a one-person show in Oakland, California. At the same time he studied value and figure drawing on weekends at California School of Arts and Crafts. Later at UC Berkeley he took classes in Oriental painting and drawing.

After attending Princeton Theological Seminary and coaching Princeton University Crews to three national championships, Art spent the next 50 years serving as a Presbyterian minister, recently retiring as Pastor Emeritus of the 2000 member Point Loma Community Presbyterian Church in San Diego.

In 1993 Art resumed his watercolor, oil and graphic artwork on his days off and vacation time. Art shows nationally and has been included in numerous juried shows. He is an active member in the San Diego Watercolor Society and has been featured in several publications. Today he works at his University Heights studio in BorrelliSpace on Park Boulevard.

Art describes his work as a mixture of representational and abstract. He usually tries to paint not what's there but what his mind and heart tell him should be there.

duke windsor Born in Texas, Duke Windsor has served as a Marine Corps combat illustrator and drill instructor. He studied classical voice at San Diego State University, later performing with the San Diego Opera Chorus. Duke has also worked as a technical/graphic illustrator, architectural draftsman and actor. He is a 4th Dan Black Belt and former martial arts teacher. He is a published cartoon artist, and has taught children's drawing and cartoon art at the San Diego Museum of Art and adult art at the San Diego Art Department. Duke has also worked as Exhibit Preparator for the San Diego Museum of Art, the Museum of Photographic Arts, the Museum of Man and Mingei International Museum.

Until recently, Duke's full-time position was Traveling Exhibits Designer for the San Diego Museum of Natural History where he designed the blockbuster Dead Sea Scrolls exhibition, which opened in June 2007.

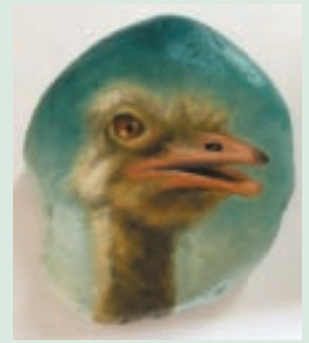
Today, Duke is currently Director of Exhibits and Lead Exhibit Designer for the USS Midway Museum, in the downtown San Diego harbor. Duke's studio is located at 1826 Howard Avenue.

larry cavenny Originally from Asheville, North Carolina, Cavenny moved to San Diego in 1999 to be with his wife and her family. Cavenny's career as an artist began in 1980 while recovering from an accident while working on a construction site in Asheville. During his recovery, he had time to reflect on his frustrations with the world and its contradictions. He channeled this energy and expression through painting, devoting his life to creating an art that is unique and his own. He stayed true to his values as his work continued to evolve over the next 27 years.

Cavenny has an established gallery career as his work has been exhibited in numerous galleries across the United States, and since moving to San Diego in 1999 in various galleries throughout San Diego County. Heavy texture is achieved in his paintings through a complex process which has taken Cavenny years to master. The materials that he uses are pushed back to hide the process of construction of overall painting. He prefers not to share with the public his process of creating, hence the name of his current exhibition "I can't say." Cavenny says "I prefer that the audience experience the painting on their own time and space." The emphasis of viewing Cavenny's painting is in witnessing the overall effect in its complete physicality.

In 1995, Cavenny began to work in sculpture in addition to painting. With sculpting Cavenny uses a chainsaw and a different set of rules to get the effects for his three dimensional work and afterwards paints directly onto the surface of the sculpture, rendering a folk art type effect. Visit Cavenny's studio at 4141 Alabama Street.

The **ART ROCKS** art pieces make their first public appearance at the August 15th preview party at Swedenborg Hall along with other representative pieces of participating artists. Some artists see this 'ARTventure', as a chance to illustrate local history. Others may play on ideas about the rock itself. Whatever the image, the results are very exciting to see! The project is a fundraiser for the 2009 University Heights Arts Open.

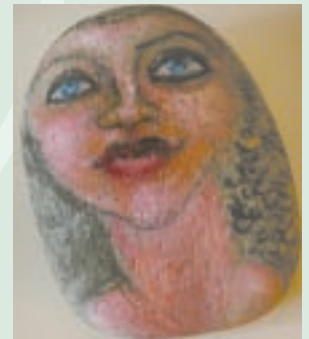

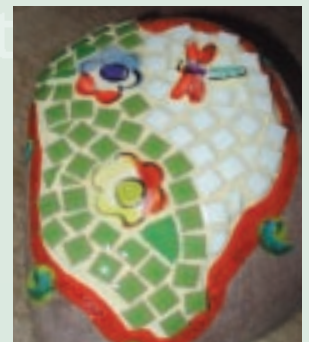

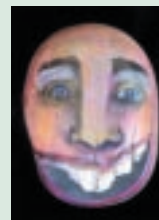
